"Putting It All Together" Activity

PAL, Patient List, Task List, Allergies and Medications by History

Step	Action
1.	Close the chart for your Classroom patient.
	Note : You will see an alert that you are closing a chart that has a PowerPlan in a Planned state. We will discuss PowerPlans later, but know that if you see this alert in Prod, you will want to contact the physician.
2.	Open the chart for your Cerner Practice Patient.
3.	Complete the Fall Risk Level – Adult task from the Task List.
4.	Document a home medication that your patient is taking: Fish Oil.

Now that we have covered the I/O / I-Flowsheet and PPOCs (Patient Plans of Care), let's do an activity to bring everything together. Use your Cerner Practice patient:

"Putting It All Together" Activity

I/O I-Flowsheet and PPOCs

Step	Action
1.	Duplicate the Physical Assessment documented earlier for the next hour.
2.	 Accept the PPOC Prevention of Alteration in Skin Integrity: Keep all of the pre-selected Goals, Indicators, and Interventions; (grey selections are required) and Sign the PPOC.

Now that we have covered **Orders**, **Medication Administration**, and **Lab Scanning**, we will do an activity to bring it all together, using your **Cerner Practice Patient**:

Cerner had a scheduled downtime and you had to take an RVTO order for Wellbutrin from the physician for your patient and administer it without scanning. Cerner came back up and now you need to enter the medication order and chart the medication administration from the MAR for the current Time:

Step	Action
1.	Open the chart for your Cerner Practice patient.
2.	 Order Wellbutrin 100mg tablet BID. Dr. Andrew Nigh / Dictation #: 14031 RVTO
3.	Nurse Review the medication from the Nurse Review band.
4.	Document the Wellbutrin (manually/not with a scan) on the MAR .
